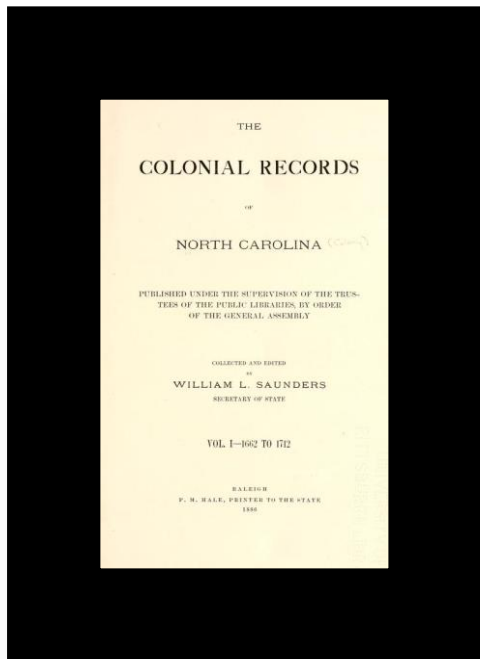


# The Colonial and State Records of North Carolina Available at Chatham Historical Museum

For those who prefer to turn the pages of a printed book rather than to search online, CCHA has made its copy of *The Colonial and State Records of North Carolina* available at the Chatham Historical Museum. The collection is housed in Gallery 106, across from the



CCHA office in Chatham's Historic Courthouse. The series covers the earliest days of North Carolina's settlement by Europeans through the ratification of the United States Constitution, and includes transcribed and printed documents and materials from throughout the country and from several European repositories. Published between 1886 and 1907, the set also includes a four-volume cumulative index.
